NERAM–Wynne Exhibition

On Friday, students travelled to NERAM where they viewed artworks from the 2023 Wynne Prize. The Wynne Prize is the oldest art competition in Australia at 127 years old. Landscape paintings and figure sculptures are eligible to be entered, and the prize is a whopping \$50,000.

Upon entering the exhibition, the first paining was of Lake Eyre by John Olsen, which students have been learning about in English and in the process of producing a travel brochure on.

The artworks were incredible and students were captivated by an AI generated skull sculpture that took the artist 2 years to write the computer program which allowed the mirror to project the skull in the way he envisioned.

Another artwork students enjoyed was the one pictured below of the rats. This painting was inspired by rats that got addicted to coffee grounds in restaurant bins in Sydney. The restaurant owners had to come up with a plan to stop them from getting into the coffee grounds as it was making the rats aggressive and giving them super strength. The students found this hilarious, as the rats experienced withdrawal symptoms as illustrated in the painting.


