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UNE Discovery Bus

Last week, Chandler Public School was thrilled to welcome the UNE Discovery Voyager, a mobile science and technology experience designed to ignite curiosity and inspire students in the world of science. The morning was filled with engaging activities, with two standout sessions: Dynamic Bodies and The Magic of Physics.

In the Dynamic Bodies workshop, students had the opportunity to discover what makes a successful sportsperson by exploring the relationship between physiology and performance. Utilising clinical state-of-the-art equipment, they measured a range of biomotor abilities, including speed, agility and strength to determine performance indicators and learnt how different sports and athletes require different training targets. Students got into some friendly competition as they explored the importance of exercise in our everyday lives and how measurements in exercise physiology help us understand more about how our bodies function. The experiments made the learning experience both fun and memorable. The excitement was palpable as students discovered the intricate systems that keep our bodies moving and healthy.

Meanwhile, The Magic of Physics session captivated students with the wonders of physical science. In this hands-on, play based activity, students used scientific principles to learn how to do science tricks that look a lot like 'magic'. Many of these are tricks students can try out at home. Students used the properties of light, sound, magnetism, and other physical forces to create astonishing 'magical' effects within their very own hands.

The Magic of Physics inspires students by showing that feeling awe and the beauty about the natural world does not need to rely on mystery. Knowing how something works – and being able to use that knowledge – makes the world a more magical place.

The visit from the UNE Discovery Voyager was not just educational; it was a day of discovery, teamwork, and fun that left a lasting impression on our students. We extend our heartfelt thanks to the UNE Discovery team for their dedication to fostering a love for science and to our teachers for their support in making the day a success.

We look forward to more opportunities like this in the future, as we continue to inspire our students to explore the fascinating world of science!
